





Graph 2: Inverclyde council ASB Community Warden Incidents







Graph 1: Type of recorded crimes in Gourock



Graph 2: Inverclyde council ASB Community Warden Incidents







Graph 1: Type of recorded crimes in Greenock Central




Graph 2: Inverclyde council ASB Community Warden Incidents (Source: Inverclyde Council, 2020)









Graph 1: Type of recorded crimes in Greenock Southwest



Graph 2: Inverclyde council ASB Community Warden Incidents







Graph 1: Type of recorded crimes in Greenock West & Cardwell Bay




Graph 2: Inverclyde council ASB Community Warden Incidents (Source: Inverclyde Council, 2020)





Graph 1: Type of recorded crimes in Holefarm & Cowdenknowes




Graph 2: Inverclyde council ASB Community Warden Incidents (Source: Inverclyde Council, 2020)





Graph 1: Type of recorded crimes in Inverkip & Wemyss Bay




Graph 2: Inverclyde council ASB Community Warden Incidents (Source: Inverclyde Council, 2020)





Graph 1: Type of recorded crimes in Kilmacolm




Graph 2: Inverclyde council ASB Community Warden Incidents (Source: Inverclyde Council, 2020)





Graph 1: Type of recorded crimes in Larkfield, Braeside & Branchton




Graph 2: Inverclyde council ASB Community Warden Incidents (Source: Inverclyde Council, 2020)





Graph 1: Type of recorded crimes in Port Glasgow East




Graph 2: Inverclyde council ASB Community Warden Incidents (Source: Inverclyde Council, 2020)





Graph 1: Type of recorded crimes in Port Glasgow West




Graph 2: Inverclyde council ASB Community Warden Incidents (Source: Inverclyde Council, 2020)

Scottish Fire and Rescue

Last month there were 3 call outs for the fire service to respond to 2 primary and 1 secondary fires, totalling 70 over the past year. The call outs were 9% of the total number across Inverclyde for the month.

Primary fires generally involve property and include buildings, caravans, motor vehicles and plant and machinery. Secondary fires are often minor and include the burning of rubbish, grass and derelict properties.
