How to Make Your VE Day 75 Great British Bunting

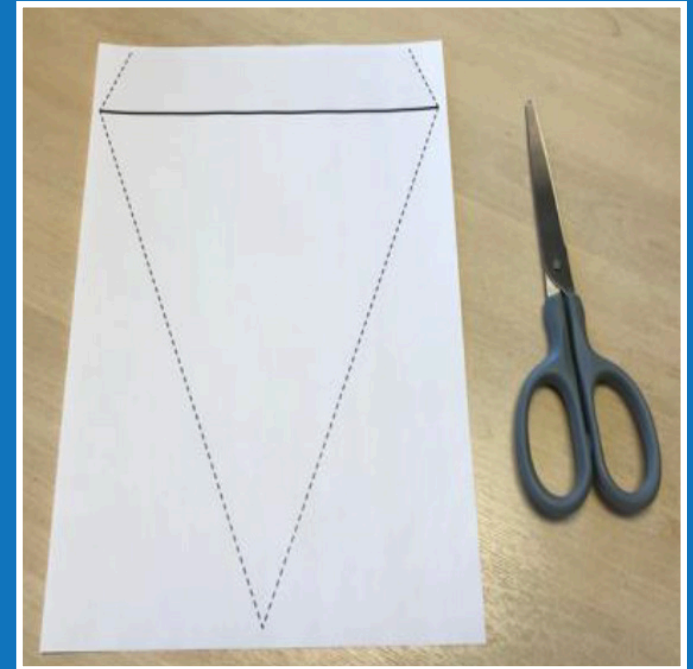

1) Make Your Flags

You can print out a template or make your own

To print out the template:

- Download and print the template from www.inverclyde.gov.uk/VE75
- Cut along the dotted lines



To make your own template:

- Take an A4 piece of paper long ways up (portrait)
- Fold over about 2cm at the top
- Fold the paper in half long ways

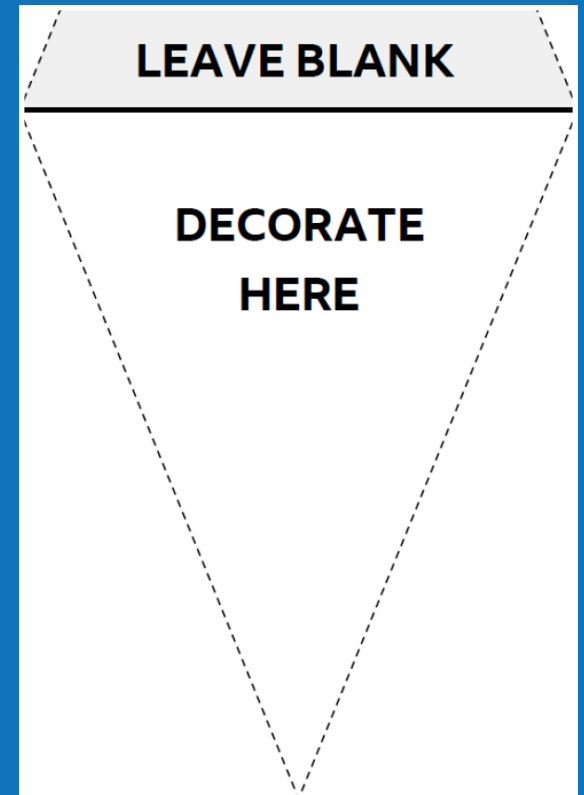


- **Draw a line diagonally from the outside of the paper at the top to the fold in the middle at the bottom**
- **Cut along that line through both sides of the paper**
- **Unfold your paper**



2) Make Your Flags

- Decorate the main triangle but leave the top strip blank
- You can decorate with anything you want – paint, pencils, collage, glitter, stickers, crayons, pens or whatever you have at home!





You can draw anything that inspires you but here are some ideas if you get stuck:

- **A soldier from WW2**
- **A ship on the Clyde**
- **A plane**
- **Union Jack / Saltire**
- **A grandparent or great grandparent who was in the war**
- **A dove of peace**
- **A poppy**
- **An Area of Inverclyde**
- **Your message of Thanks**

3) Construct Your Bunting

- **When you've decorated all of your triangles, fold along the solid black line to make a flap**
- **Put the flap over your string or ribbon and glue or tape the flap in place**



- **Leave a gap between each triangle and keep adding them until you're done and leave a spare bit of string/ribbon on each end for hanging**
- **Hang your bunting in your window for people to enjoy!**
