	Possibility of community contracted infection or passing it on.	Covid-19 is active in the community, therefore vulnerable employees to be re-deployed to less affected areas or sent home. I.e. those who are elderly, have underlying health conditions or are vulnerable to infection as per NHS guidelines (see para 9&10 of this document).		
7.	COVID-19 Coronavirus - Grounds staff coming into contact with contaminated surfaces within depot bothy/building during lunch break:	 Working day limited to 5 hours. Employees advised to take break outside where possible. Soap and water available in toilets Staff welfare areas cleaned on a regular basis, step up of cleaning regimes to be more regular and staff advised to increase cleaning of door handles, light switches and other areas which are regularly used. Disinfectant wipes available for microwaves, and kettle so that they can be cleaned on a regular basis. Seating within canteen area spaced out to maintain at least 2 meter social distancing. Staggered stop/start times to minimise staff numbers within depot welfare facility. 		Hand sanitiser available in canteen

12 Cleaning and Disinfection

Once a possible case has left the premises, the immediate area occupied by the individual e.g. vehicle, should be left 72 hrs, cleaned with detergent and disinfectant. This should include any potentially contaminated high contact areas such as door handles, telephones, grab-rails Once this process has been completed, the area can be put back into use.

Any public areas where a symptomatic individual has only passed through (spent minimal time in) e.g. corridors, not visibly contaminated with any body fluids do not need to be further decontaminated beyond routine cleaning processes.

Clean down the surface with detergent and disinfectant (a solution of 1 part bleach to 10 parts water, Milton solution or equivalent). Procedure

- 1. Wash hands
- 2. Wear disposable gloves
- 3. Use disposable cloths and mop heads
- 4. Wipe down surfaces
- 5. When finished dispose of cloths, sponges and gloves. Double bag leave 72 Hrs then dispose in general waste stream.
