Recycling journeys

By recycling as much as possible you can help to make sure that the materials you no longer need are used for something else in the future.



Food and drink cartons

Liquid food and drink cartons are pulped then the aluminium and polythene are separated from the paper. Paper board pulp is used to make new paper products that need to be strong such as filing products and paper bags. The long, strong fibres from food and drinks cartons can be recycled up to eight times.



Textiles

Textiles are taken to a reprocessor where they are sorted. Those that are in good condition are sent to charity for reuse. Those that are in poor condition are recycled into industrial cloth.



Small domestic appliances

The small electrical items that you recycle are stripped down into component parts such as metal, chipboard and plastic. The separated materials are then reused or recycled into new products.

There are also over 45 Neighbourhood Recycling Points across Inverclyde where you can recycle paper, card, cans, plastic bottles, plastic food containers and glass.

Commercial Waste: Commercial waste must be disposed of at the Pottery Street site, as the terms of the site licence for Kirn Drive exclude the disposal of commercial waste. A valid tipping permit will be required, these can be purchased at the Pottery Street Depot. Please refer to the Scale of Charges at www.inverclyde.gov.uk or call the Recycling Helpline on 01475 715901.

Household Waste: Householders using private cars can use either Kirn Drive or Pottery Street. However, due to Site Licence Restrictions at Kirn Drive, householders who intend to use a van to dispose of household waste must use the Pottery Street site. You should contact the Pottery Street site in advance to arrange admission by calling 01475 714750/714800. Failure to do this may result in you being refused entry.

What can be recycled?

- MDF and low grade wood e.g. laminate flooring

- Newspapers and magazines
- Paint
- Paper
- Rubble
- Scrap metal
- Soil (Pottery Street only)
- Textiles and shoes
- Tyres (Pottery Street only)
- TVs and monitors
- WEEE (Waste Electrical and Electronic Equipment) small to medium domestic appliances e.g. kettles, irons, games consoles
- WEEE large domestic appliances e.g. fridges, cookers (Pottery Street only)

You may find it useful to sort your materials before arrival at the site.
