As outlined in section 7. above, a reduction in the available CRA will potentially impact the ability to enhance, maintain and protect the built and natural environment and core Councils assets.

The built environment maintained via the CRA also includes a number of heritage assets i.e. listed buildings and buildings within conservation areas.

A reduction in the CRA will also impact Property Services ability to respond to the day to day and planned maintenance requirements of the estate and assets utilised by the communities of Inverclyde also limiting any opportunities of delivering a service that reflects the aspirations of continuous improvement, innovation and effective use of resources.

Consultation/Engagement	In the 2022 budget consultation 40% of respondents supported this budget saving proposal.
Research	An enquiry through the Scottish Heads of Property Services (SHoPS) network confirmed that a number of other Councils are considering a reduction in their repair and maintenance budgets.
Officer's knowledge and experience (including feedback from frontline staff)	Knowledge of annual expenditure of the CRA and asset demands including the increasing need for implementation of emergency spend only instruction towards the end of the financial year due to budget pressures/lack of funds.
