Financial Fitness	Financial Fitness are already seeing a marked increase in enquiries from Inverclyde residents affected by the ongoing energy situation and general cost of living crisis. To increase their capacity to support local people, Financial Fitness are providing an additional telephone triage service to allow said individuals to receive telephone advice as quickly as possible. They will double the triage support to 2 days per week, which will enable them to provide 20 additional days-worth of advice and support for Inverclyde residents worried about the current energy and cost-of-living situation.
