#### 1.0 PURPOSE

1.1 The purpose of this Report is to request the Board to determine the 2014 – 2015 Festive Season Policy with regard to Extended Hours applications for Premises Licences and Occasional Licence applications for non licensed premises.

#### 2.0 SUMMARY

- 2.1 Last year the Board agreed a 'blanket' extension across Inverclyde in terms of Section 67 Appendix 1 of the Act. A copy of the Festive Season Policy 2013 2014 is attached as Appendix 1 to this report for information purposes.
- 2.2 Police Scotland were asked for their views on this year's policy and indicated they would speak to the report at the Licensing Board meeting.
- 2.3 The Licensing Board Policy Statement identifies that the festive period will be considered by the Board on an annual basis. The Board are therefore asked to consider:-
  - (a) the period to which the Festive Season will cover, being Friday 12 December 2014 to Friday 2 January 2014 inclusive;
  - (b) the days and hours premises may be open during this period for both nightclub and non-nightclub premises;
  - (c) the terminal hour for Wednesday 24 December and Wednesday 31 December 2014;
  - (d) that the event being held must relate to the festive season e.g. Christmas Party Night, Hogmanay, and <u>not</u> to Birthday Parties, Weddings etc. or whether extensions may be granted as per the Festive Season Policy agreed during this period regardless of the type of event proposed;
  - (e) if the curfew of 12 Midnight should be relaxed to 12.30 a.m. or 1.00 a.m. on 31 December 2014; and
  - (f) the last lodging / notification date of Friday 28 November 2014 for accepting extended hours applications / notifications to assist the administration process, if applicable.
  - (g) to /....

- (g) to consider if the Festive Season Policy is determined by:-
  - (i) Section 68 of the Act whereby licence holders require to lodge an application form or notify the Licensing Section of their preferred dates within the Policy.

OR

- (ii) Section 67 of the Act whereby the Licensing Board may agree a 'blanket' extension in connection with a special event of local or national significance, extend licensing hours by such a period as the Board may determine.
- 2.4 The Board are also asked to consider whether an Occasional Licence application made for non-licensed premises e.g Greenock Town Hall, Gamble Halls, Port Glasgow Town Hall, for an event within the festive period be granted in terms of the Festive Season Policy for events solely related to festive activities.
- 2.5 In making their decision, the Board may wish to note that during consultation of the Licensing Board Policy Statement, Members agreed to an increase of the terminal core licensing hour on Friday and Saturday to 1.30 a.m. for premises offering no significant entertainment and to 3.30 a.m. (Bar to Close 3.00 a.m.) for premises offering significant entertainment facilities.

### 3.0 RECOMMENDATION

3.1 It is recommended that the Board consider the Festive Season Policy for 2014 - 2015 and determine the contents thereof.

Inverclyde Licensing Board at their meeting on 19 September 2013 agreed the Festive Season Policy 2013 - 2014 in terms of Section 67 of the Licensing (Scotland) Act 2005 to permit Premises Licences (except Off Sales) to extend the terminal Core Hour of the premises on the following dates and hours, if so wish:-

# FRIDAY 13 DECEMBER 2013 – THURSDAY 2 JANUARY 2014 INCLUSIVE

Premises Licence (except Nightclubs) Premises may open: Sunday – Wednesday - 1.00 am Thursday – Saturday – 2.00 am Premises Licence (Nightclubs) Premises may open: Sunday – Wednesday – 2.00 am Thursday - Saturday – 3.30 am (bar to close 3.00 am)

Note: Tuesday 24 December, Wednesday 25 December, Tuesday 31 December 2013 and Wednesday 1 January 2014 may have the same terminal hour as Thursday – Saturday.

# **NOTIFICATION BY 29 NOVEMBER 2013**

There is <u>NO</u> requirement to submit an Extended Hours application for the above dates and hours however the event being held within the premises <u>MUST</u> relate to the festive season e.g. Christmas Party, Hogmanay. This extension does <u>NOT</u> include a birthday party, anniversary, charity event, christening etc. Applications for these type of events should be applied for in the normal manner.

You should notify Police Scotland, Licensing Department if you wish to utilise any of the extensions and advise them on what nights you will be operating. Please advise them by **29 November 2013** by e-mail to:-

# **CURFEW AND CONDITIONS**

The curfew will be relaxed on the evening of 31 December to 1.00 a.m. on 1 January.

The requirements of the Licensing Conditions (Late Opening Premises) (Scotland) Regulations 2007 will apply to premises opening after 1.00 a.m.
