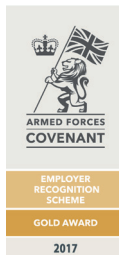

John - **EYECO**

There is a huge variety of duties and tasks in this job with always new things happening. I help children in an early years environment such as a nursery. Its really rewarding and we would encourage more men to consider this line of work.

Jacqueline - **Building Standards Officer**

Duties include assessing building warrant applications to determine compliance with building legislation and prepare documentation required. You

also do site inspections of warrant works together with inspections of premises, where licensing is required. You need ICT skills to the building standards systems. Although there are standard hours for this job, I have access to flexi time and can choose to start at a time that suits my need.



James - **Senior Home Support Worker**

As a Senior you contribute to the management and delivery of home care services and supervise a small team of home support workers and direct service provision. The great thing about the post is promoting independence for service users whilst working with other professionals. By providing personal care and practical assistance to people in their own homes we get to assist people with tasks such as getting in/out of bed, eating, washing and dressing. These practical tasks allow service users to maintain their independence.

You need previous experience of caring for older people or people with disabilities and to

understand their needs and their carers' needs and be aware of the person's right to dignity, privacy and confidentiality.



Catherine - **Head Teacher Secondary**

As Head Teacher you are responsible for conducting the affairs of the school to the benefit of the pupils and the community it serves through pursuing objectives and implementing policies set by the education authority. You have to manage staff, school policies, school curriculum etc and work in partnership with parents, agencies and other professionals.
