Mr Lamb, Messrs Maitlands was present representing the applicant together with Mr Bateman, Director of Reo's Ltd.

Mr Douglas advised that no objections or representations had been received, the hours applied for are within the Board's Policy although note that Mr Lamb has indicated the Off Sales Hours have to be removed. Mr Douglas intimated that the Planning Section 50 Certificate is in place, the Environmental Health and Building Standards Section 50 Certificates are outstanding.

Mr Lamb confirmed that the Off Sales hours applied for have to be removed as the premises will not operate an off sales facility. Mr Lamb addressed the Board on the alterations to the premises and advised that a site visit is arranged with Building Standards Officers for early next week and hopefully the outstanding Section 50 Certificates will be issued soon thereafter. Mr Bateman provided information to the Board on the operation of the premises. With regard to children and young persons being permitted on the premises, Mr Lamb amended the application to within the Board's Policy and removed the request for children and young persons to be admitted for the purpose of playing snooker.

There was a discussion between Members and Mr Lamb as to Police Scotland knowing when the premises will be open and how this could be managed. Mr Lamb asked the Board to note that the gaming machines on the premises which were operated by the Club have been removed and his client's will not be applying to site gaming machines on the premises.
