P R E F A C E .

IN presenting the Thirteenth volume of this series of the Post-OFFICE GREENOCK DIRECTORY to the Public, the Publishers considered it necessary to remark that many new dwelling-houses were being built in the town, showing that the builders had confidence in the future ; and in presenting the Fourteenth yearly volume, in 1861, when the Census was taken, the population was stated to be 43,206, exclusive of about 2,000 persons belonging to the town who were at sea, or 45,206 in all. In presenting the Fifteenth volume no allusion to this important matter was considered to be necessary ; but now in presenting the Sixteenth volume the Publishers have pleasure in stating that if the population were exactly stated at 45,206 in 1861, it cannot now be estimated as under 50,000 persons. This great increase has chiefly been caused by the large contracts being fulfilled in the town by the shipbuilding and engineering firms, who have a great number of additional workmen in their employment. The demand for workmen's houses at last term was unprecedented. The Customhouse revenue of the port, and the Harbour revenue, have also greatly increased.

A large new harbour, called the Albert Harbour, is being formed at the West-end, near Bay of Quick, and that work has also added considerably to the demand for labour.

The Publishers have exerted themselves to improve the Directory in every department, and they trust it will be found to be as exact and useful as any local Directory in the kingdom ; and they are gratified to observe that the Public continue to recognise it as an excellent means of advertising trades, professions, and business cards.

The Publishers will always have pleasure in attending to the suggestions of those who can aid them in improving the Directory, for it is their earnest desire to sustain its reputation, and to merit the support of the Public.

STAMP DUTIES.

(INLAND BILL) DRAFT OR ORDER, after the 10th October, 1853, for the payment of any sum of money to the bearer, or to order on demand, 1d. And the following instruments shall be deemed and taken to be drafts or orders for the payment of money within the intent and meaning of this Act, and of any Act or Acts relating to the stamp duties on bills of exchange, drafts or orders, and shall be chargeable accordingly with the stamp duties imposed by this Act or any such Act or Acts, viz. : All documents or writings usually termed letters of credit, or whereby any person to whom any such document or writing is or is intended to be delivered or sent, shall be entitled, or be intended to be entitled to have credit with or in account with, or to draw upon any other person for, or to receive from such other person any sum of money therein mentioned.

EXEMPTIONS.—Any Draft or Order drawn by any Banker upon any other Banker, not payable to bearer, or to order, and used solely for the purpose of settling or clearing any account between said banker. Any letter written by a banker to any other banker directing the payment of any sum of money, the same not being payable to bearer or to order, and such letter not being sent or delivered to the person to whom payment is to be made, or to any person on his behalf.

INLAND BILL, DRAFT, or ORDER for the payment of any sum of money, though not made payable to the bearer, or to order, if the same shall be delivered to the payee, or some person on his or her behalf, the same duty as on a bill of exchange for the like sum, payable to bearer or order.

INLAND BILL, DRAFT or ORDER for the payment of any sum of money weekly, monthly, or at any other stated periods, if made payable to the bearer, or to order, or if delivered to the payee, or to some person on his or her behalf, where the total amount of the money thereby made payable shall be specified therein, or can be ascertained therefrom, or shall be indefinite, the same duty as on a bill payable to bearer or order on demand.

PROMISSORY NOTE for the payment of any sum of money by instalments, or for the payment of several sums of money at different days or times, so that the whole of the money to be paid shall be definite and certain, the same duty as on a promissory note, payable otherwise than to the bearer on demand, for a sum equal to the whole amount of the money to be paid.

N.B.—The duties on Foreign Bills, drawn out of the United Kingdom, are to be denoted by adhesive stamps. The amount of duty on adhesive stamps is impressed on two parts. The Board of Inland Revenue recommend that the cancellation should be one of the parts and the other left legible.

If a Foreign Bill payable abroad, and as to which the provision “drawn in sets of three or more” apply, should be drawn in a single bill, the duty will be the same as on an Inland Bill, and if in a set of two, the duty on each will be the same as on an Inland Bill. This is in accordance with the opinion of the Board of Inland Revenue. But the Board have given an opinion that a Foreign Bill drawn abroad and payable in this country in duplicate or triplicate only represents one transaction, and is liable to the duty on one Inland Bill of the same amount—that is, if one of the parts have the full duty, the others may be unstamped. The schedule of the act does not provide for such a Bill being drawn in sets. Bills bearing to be drawn out of the United Kingdom are to be deemed Foreign Bills so drawn, although they may in reality be drawn in the United Kingdom, 17 and 18 Vict. c. 83 § 4. A person in the United Kingdom drawing and issuing a bill payable out of United Kingdom in a set, must draw the whole set, and a person transferring or negotiating such bill must transfer and deliver, stamped, the whole number of the set. Penalty £100. A person taking such bill must get the whole stamped, or otherwise he cannot recover on it or make it available, ib. § 6. This applies only to bills drawn within and payable out of the United Kingdom.

RATES OF POSTAGE & CONDITIONS OF TRANSMISSION.

Inland Letters.

The rate of Postage on all inland letters is regulated by weight, irrespective of distance, and with the exception afterwards mentioned, is as follows :—

If paid in advance.

and so on ; twopence being charged for every additional ounce.

Unpaid Letters.

As a general rule, the postage, if not paid in advance, is double the foregoing ; and if the payment in advance be insufficient, double the deficiency is charged. An inland letter, for example, weighing more than half an ounce, and not exceeding one ounce, if bearing a penny stamp only, is, on delivery, charged twopence. The unpaid *additional* postage on re-directed letters, however, is not doubled, being the same as if such postage were prepaid. Unless three quarters, at least, of the postage of a letter weighing more than 4 oz. be prepaid, the letter is not forwarded, but notice of its detention is given to the sender, or when that is not practicable, to the person to whom the letter is addressed.

* If the weight be exceeded to the smallest extent, even though the balance be merely turned, the letter becomes liable to a higher postage. The same rule applies to letters going abroad. To provide, therefore, for errors in scales, &c., it is well to allow a little margin, or to pay the postage of the next greater weight.

II. Newspapers and other periodical publications bearing the Newspaper Stamp.

Although the provision is made for forwarding newspapers, books, and money through the post, it is not compulsory on any one to employ this mode of transmission; every thing except letters may be sent in any other way.

All periodical publications, including newspapers, published in the United Kingdom, at intervals not exceeding thirty-one days, and which bear an impressed stamp or stamps denoting the stamp duty (of the kind formerly confined chiefly to newspapers) may be transmitted and re-transmitted through the post within the United Kingdom free of postage.

INLAND BOOK POST.

The following are the regulations of the Inland Book Post:—

1st. Rates of Postage:

and so on, 2d being charged for every additional half pound or fraction of a half pound.

- 2d The postage must be prepaid, to the extent of one rate at least; by means of postage stamps affixed outside the packet or its cover; and if the whole postage be not thus prepaid the packet is treated in the manner described in Section 9.
- 3d Every packet must be sent either without a cover, or in a cover open at the ends or sides; so as to admit of the enclosures being removed for examination. For the greater security of its contents the packet may be tied at the ends with string, but in such case the Postmaster is authorised to cut the string, although he is required to refasten the packet.
- 4th A book-packet may contain any number of separate books or other publications (including printed letters and printed matter of every kind), photographs, when not on glass or in cases containing glass, prints, or maps, and any quantity of paper, parchment or vellum. And the books or other publications, prints, maps, &c., may be either printed, written, or plain, or any mixture of the three. Further, all legitimate binding, mounting, or covering of a book, &c., or of a portion thereof, will be allowed, whether such binding, &c., be loose or at-

tached ; so also rollers, in the case of prints or maps ; markers (whether of papers or otherwise), in books ; and, in short whatever is necessary for the safe transmission of literary matter, prints, or maps, or usually appertains thereto ; but no patterns, or books of patterns (unless these consist merely of paper) can be allowed.

- 5th. No book packet may contain anything which is sealed or otherwise closed against inspection ; nor must there be any letter, nor any communication of the nature of a letter, whether separate or otherwise, unless the whole of such letter or communication be printed. Entries, however, merely stating who sends the book, &c., or to whom it is given, are not regarded as a letter. Indeed, as respects the name and address of the sender, not only is the writing permitted but recommended ; so that if the cover come off, or for any other reason the packet cannot be forwarded, it may be returned.
- 6th. No book must exceed two feet in length, width, or depth ; and if any such packet be presented at a Post Office it will not be received.
- 7th. Any packet which shall not be open at the ends or sides, or shall have any written letter, or any communication of the nature of a letter written in it, or upon its cover, will be charged with the "unpaid" letter postage.
- 8th. If a packet be found to contain any written letter, whether closed or open, or any enclosure sealed or otherwise closed against inspection, or any other unauthorised enclosure, the letter or enclosure will be taken out and forwarded to the address on the packet, charged with the full postage as an unpaid letter, together with an additional rate ; and the remainder of the packet, if duly prepaid with stamps, will then be forwarded to its address.
- 9th. If a packet be not sufficiently prepaid with stamps, but nevertheless bear a stamp of the value of one rate, it is forwarded, charged with the deficient book-postage, together with an additional rate ; but any packet which bears no postage stamp is charged with the "unpaid" letter postage.
- 10th. In every case in which the postage chargeable under these regulations is greater than the letter rate, the latter postage is substituted.

POSTAGE STAMPS.

Every Postmaster is required to have on hand a sufficient stock of postage labels and embossed penny envelopes, and to sell them to the Public at the following prices:—

Two kinds of embossed envelopes are now issued; one with a thread passing through the stamp, and the other without any thread, but made with thicker and better paper

No coloured paper can be received for stamping, or any paper which is too thin to bear the impression of the dies.

Envelopes provided by the office of Inland Revenue, with the proper stamps thereon, will be substituted for any which may be spoiled in the operation of stamping.

A license to sell postage stamps can be obtained, free of expense, by any respectable person on application to the office of the Inland Revenue.

REGISTRATION.

By the payment of a fee of fourpence, any letter, newspaper, book, or other packet on which the postage has been prepaid in stamps, may be registered to any place within the United Kingdom. Book packets and newspapers can also be registered to the colonies. To foreign countries *letters only* can be registered. The registration of a packet makes its transmission more secure, by rendering it practicable to trace it, when inland, from its receipt to its delivery; and when colonial or foreign, if not to its delivery, at least to the port of despatch. The Post Office does not guarantee the safe delivery of the letter, &c., though any officer who may neglect his duty on this point, will be called to strict account, and if the Postmaster-General think fit, will be required to make good any loss that may be sustained.

The postage and registration fee of registered letters must be prepaid; and if the letters be inland, such prepayment must be by stamps.

Every letter to be registered should be presented at the windows and a receipt obtained for it, and must on no account be dropped into the letter-box. If, contrary to this rule, a letter marked "Registered" be dropped into the letter-box, it will, *if directed to any place in the United Kingdom*, be liable to a registration fee of one shilling, instead of the ordinary fee of fourpence. No Letter-Carrier or Rural Messenger is required to take letters for the Public to have them registered.

Letters containing coin should not *under any circumstance* be dropped into the letter-box, but handed in at the bar of the Post Office to be registered. In the event of letters for London, or any place which circulates through London, being posted containing coin, they are treated as registered letters, and charged with double the registration fee.

Prepayment of inland letters, &c., must be by labels or embossed stamps,* except at the Chief Post Office, London, where prepayment of such letters from 10 a.m. till 5 p.m., is permitted in money, provided the amount be not less than £1. Letters also to the colonies and foreign countries may be prepaid in money. Except in the case of letters posted in Malta, Gibraltar, Constantinople, Alexandria, Cairo, Suez, Buenos Ayres, Lago, and Fernando Po, and those sent by officers and seamen serving on board Her Majesty's ships, British postage stamps are not available for the payment of letters, &c., *coming into this country*.

By using embossed envelopes all risk of the stamp being detached may be avoided; but when labels are used these should be examined to see that they firmly adhere, since if they fall off, the letters, &c., will be charged with postage; which in the case of inland letters is double the prepaid rate. To some places abroad also, double the prepaid rate is chargeable in such cases; and in other instances the letters, &c., are liable to be detained for the deficient postage. The labels should be placed on the front of the letter, and upon the upper corner of the right hand side.

Arrangements have been made by which paper and envelopes taken by the public to the office of Inland Revenue, Somerset House, can be embossed with stamps equal to any rate of postage, (including a threepenny stamp), under the following regulations:

* Payment in labels must always be made by affixing outside the letter, &c., before it is posted, a number of labels equal in value to the amount of postage.

-
- 1st. When the stamps required do not amount to £10 worth, one shilling is charged, in addition to the postage stamps, for each distinct size of paper.
 - 2d. When the stamps amount to £10 worth, no fee is charged, provided one size of paper money be sent.
 - 3d. When the stamps amount to £20 worth, no fee is charged, provided not more than two sizes of paper be sent.
 - 4th. When the stamps amount to £30 no fee is charged, provided not more than three sizes of paper be sent.
 - 5th. When the stamps amount to £40 no fee is charged, provided four sizes of paper only be sent; and no more than four sizes can be received on a single warrant.†
 - 6th. No *folded* envelopes can be stamped; and therefore paper, whether intended for envelopes or letters, must be sent unfolded and without being creased.
-

MONEY ORDERS.

The public are recommended when applying for Money Orders, to use printed "Application Forms," which save time, and afford greater security, than verbal messages, against mistakes. These Forms are supplied gratuitously at all Money Order Offices.

The commission on an Inland Money Order not exceeding £2 is threepence, above £2 and under £5 sixpence, above £5 and under £7 ninepence, above £7 and under £10 one shilling; above which amount no single Order can be granted, but as many £10 Orders may be granted as is desirable. The commission on Money Orders to Canada, between Australia, Victoria, and Cape of Good Hope, is fourfold these sums, and on Money Orders payable at Malta or Gibraltar threefold.

No order is allowed to contain a fractional part of a penny.

With the subjoined exceptions, no Money Order can be issued unless the applicant furnish in full, the surname and at least the initial of one Christian name, both of the remitter (the person who sends the order) and the payee (the person to whom the money is to be paid), together with the remitter's address:—

- 1st. If the remitter or payee be a peer or a bishop, his ordinary title is sufficient; and if a firm, the usual designation of such firm
-

† The warrants (or requisition forms) used in applying for paper to be stamped are obtainable on application at the office of Inland Revenue, Somerset House, London. W.C.

will suffice (the term "Messrs," however, is not sufficient,) except a company trading under a title which does not consist of the names of the persons composing it, as the "Carron Company," to which kind of company the above privilege does not extend.

- 2d. Money Orders for transmission by the Public to the Privy Council Office will be issued payable to the "Privy Council Office," the name of the payee not being required in these cases.
- 3d. When the remitter notifies in writing that the order is to be paid through a bank, it is left to his option to give or withhold the name of the payee; and he may, if he wish it, substitute for the name of the payee, any other designation or any modification of the name, as for example:—"The Cashier of the Bank of England,"—"The Chief Clerk of the Foreign Office,"—"The Publisher of *The Times*,"—"Messrs Longman & Co."

When application is made for a Money Order payable in London or at any other town where there is more than one Money Order Office, the remitter should say at which of such offices he wishes it to be paid, otherwise the order can be cashed at the Head Office alone. It is not incumbent on a Postmaster to supply such information relative to local or provincial offices, but the nearest Money Order Office to any street in London may be ascertained by referring to the Street List published in the Post Office Regulations.

An Order once issued cannot be cancelled; and should repayment or transfer to a different office or alteration of name be required the remitter must apply to the issuing or paying Postmaster according to the directions printed on the back of the Order.

The remitter of an order may make that order payable ten days after date, provided he sign the requisition "C." printed on the back of that order, to defer payment till ten days after date, and affix a penny receipt stamp thereto.

When an order is presented for payment (otherwise than through a bank) the Postmaster has first to see that the signature of the payee be as full as the name given in the advice, and be not in any way inconsistent therewith. He has then to call on the applicant to give the name of the remitter, and if the reply be correct, the order will be paid, unless the Postmaster have good reason for believing that the applicant for payment is neither the rightful claimant, nor deputed by him. When an order is paid through a

bank it is sufficient that it be receipted (without regard to any discrepancy between the signature and the name in the advice, or to whether the receipt is given by the payee himself or by another person,) and that it be presented (crossed with the name of the receiving bank,) by some person known to be in the employment of the bank.

The holder of a Money Order is always at liberty to direct, by crossing it, that the order be paid through a bank, even though its payment was not originally so restricted, and when the order is thus crossed, the question put on the presentation of an ordinary Money Order is dispensed with.

POST OFFICE SAVINGS BANKS.

The following Regulations have been made under Authority of the Act of Parliament, 24 Vict., cap. 14, entitled "An Act to grant additional facilities for depositing small savings at interest, with the security of the Government for due repayment thereof," and were brought into operation on the 16th of September, 1861.

Every Post Office, being a Money Order Office, at which the Postmaster-General shall permit deposits to be received for remittance to his principal office, will be open for that purpose, and for the repayment of monies withdrawn, during the hours appointed for transaction of Money Order business at the said Post Office.

Any Post Office, not being a Money Order Office, at which the Postmaster-General shall permit deposits to be received or repaid, shall be open for that purpose during such hours and such days as the Postmaster-General shall determine.

Deposits of one shilling, or of any number of shillings, or of pounds and shillings, will be received from any Depositor at the Post Office Savings Banks, provided the deposits made by such Depositors in any year ending on the 31st day of December do not exceed £30, and provided the total amount standing in such Depositor's name in the books of the Postmaster-General do not exceed £150, exclusive of interest. When the principal and interest together, standing to the credit of any one Depositor, amount to the sum of £200, all interest will cease so long as the same funds continue to amount to the said sum of £200.

Every Depositor on making a first deposit shall be required to specify his Christian name and surname, occupation, and residence to the officer of the Postmaster-General appointed to receive the deposit, and make and sign the statutory Declaration, to be witnessed by the officer of the Postmaster-General appointed to receive deposits, or by some person known to him, or by the minister or a churchwarden of the parish in which the Depositor resides, or by a justice of the peace; and if such Declaration, or any part thereof, shall not be true, the Depositor making the same shall forfeit and lose all right and title to his deposits.

On making the Declaration, and in all cases in which the signature of the Depositor is required, if the Depositor cannot write, his mark must be affixed in the presence of a witness, and attested by the signature of that witness.

Every deposit received by any officer of the Postmaster-General, appointed for that purpose, shall be entered by him at the time in a numbered book, and the entry shall be attested by him, and by the dated stamp of his office, and the said book, with the entry so attested, shall be given to the Depositor, and retained by him as primary evidence of the receipt of the deposit. The Depositor shall sign his name in a place to be provided for his signature in the Depositor's book. The amount of each deposit, and the name, occupation, and residence of the Depositor shall, upon the day of the receipt thereof, be reported to the Postmaster-General, and the acknowledgment of the Postmaster-General for the said deposit, signified in the statutory form by the officer whom he shall appoint for the purpose, shall be forthwith transmitted by post to the Depositor as the conclusive evidence of his claim to the repayment of the deposit with interest thereon.

If the Depositor does not receive the said acknowledgment within ten days from the day on which he made the deposit, he must apply for the same to the Postmaster-General, by letter, and if necessary he must renew his application to the Postmaster-General until he receives the said acknowledgment.

Interest, calculated yearly, at the rate of £2 10s per cent. per annum, shall be allowed on every complete £1 deposited, and shall be computed from the first day of the calendar month next following the day on which a complete £1 shall have been deposited, or on which deposits of a less amount shall have made up a complete £1, up to the first day of the calendar month in which monies are withdrawn.*

* The interest thus calculated will be at the rate of one halfpenny per calendar month for every complete £1.

The interest will be calculated to the 31st December in every year, and will then be added to, and become part of, the principal money.

Deposits may be made by a Trustee on behalf of another person, in the joint names of such Trustee and the person on whose account such money shall be so deposited; but repayment of the same, or any part thereof, shall not be made without the receipt or receipts of both the said parties, or the survivor or survivors, or the executors or administrators of such survivor, whose receipt and receipts either personally or by agent appointed by power of attorney, which power of attorney may be executed by an infant of or exceeding the age of 14 years, shall alone be a valid discharge, except in case of insanity or imbecility of the party on whose behalf the deposits were made, when the Postmaster-General may, on proof of the fact to his satisfaction, allow repayment to be made to the Trustee alone.

And in case any such declaration shall not be true, or if any person shall at any time have or hold or be possessed of any deposit or funds in more than one Savings Bank within the United Kingdom, every such person shall forfeit and lose all right and title to any deposit in or to any funds of any and every such Savings Bank.

Deposits may be made by, or for the benefit of, any person under 21 years of age, and repayment shall be made to such minor after the age of 7 years in the same manner as if he were of full age. In case of minors under the age of 7 years, the declaration must be made by one of the parents, or a friend, on behalf of the minor.

Deposits may be made by married women, and deposits so made, or made by women who shall afterwards marry, will be repaid to any such woman, unless her husband shall give notice in writing of such marriage to the Postmaster-General, and shall require payment to be made to him.

The Trustees of any Friendly Society, the rules of which have been certified by the Registrar of Friendly Societies in England, Scotland, or Ireland (as the case may be), or of any Charitable or Provident Society, or Penny Savings Bank, approved by the National Debt Commissioners, may deposit their funds, without restriction as to amount, in the Post Office Savings Bank, provided always that such deposits shall not be of less amount than one shilling, nor of any sum not a multiple thereof, and that a copy of the rules be forwarded by post to the Postmaster-General, with the names and addresses of the Trustees, who will then be furnished with the necessary instructions.

The statutory Declaration must be made in cases of Friendly and Charitable Societies :—

Every Depositor shall, once in each year, on the anniversary of the day, on which he made his first deposit, forward his book to the principal office of the Postmaster-General, in a cover to be obtained at any Post Office Savings Bank, in order that the entries in the said book may be compared with the entries in the books of the Postmaster-General, and that the interest due to the Depositor may be inserted in his book.

No charge shall be made upon Depositors for the books at first supplied to them, or for books issued to them in continuation thereof; but if any Depositor shall lose his book, and shall desire a new book, application must be made by him to the Postmaster-General, by letter, stating the circumstances, and enclosing Postage Stamps of the value of one shilling to pay for the new book, should the application be granted; and the Postmaster-General shall, as he thinks fit, issue a new book, or return the stamps to the applicant.

No charge for postage shall be made upon the Depositors for the transmission of their books to the Postmaster-General, or for the return thereof to them, or for any applications they may have to make for acknowledgments of deposits, or for any application or necessary letter of inquiry respecting the sums deposited by them, or for the replies thereto.

Any Depositor in the Post Office Savings Bank who may desire to transfer his deposits to any other Savings Bank legally established, shall, on his written application, accompanied by his book, to the chief office of the Postmaster-General, in a form to be obtained at any Post Office Savings Bank, be furnished with a certificate in the statutory form, of the whole amount due to him, and his account with the Post Office Savings Bank shall thereupon be closed.

Upon the delivery of such certificate to the Trustees or Managers of the Savings Bank to which it is proposed by the Depositor to transfer the deposit) they shall, if they think fit, open an account for the amount stated in such certificate, upon the Depositor making the usual declaration.

Any Depositor in any legally established Savings Bank who may desire to transfer his account to the Post Office Savings Bank may require from the Trustees or Managers of such Bank a certificate in the statutory form, signed by two Trustees of such Savings Bank, stating the amount due to him, and thereupon his account with such Bank shall be closed.

The said Certificate may be delivered to any officer of the Postmaster-General authorised to receive deposits under the Post Office Savings Bank Act, and shall be received by him as if it were a deposit of the amount therein set forth; and on the said Certificate being forwarded to London, and verified by the National Debt Commissioners, an account for the amount thereof shall be opened with the said Depositor, and an acknowledgment for the said amount sent to him.

Any Depositor wishing to withdraw the whole or part of the sum deposited by him, must make application for the same to the Postmaster-General, in the statutory form, a printed copy of which may be obtained at any Post Office Savings Bank.

In this form the Depositor must specify the number of his book, the name of the office at which his first deposit was made, the sum he wishes to withdraw, his occupation and residence, and the Post Office at which he wishes to receive his money. On receipt of this application, a warrant for the amount required, payable at the office named, shall be sent to him by post.

By the same post, the Postmaster at whose office the warrant is made payable, shall be advised of the issue of the warrant. This warrant must be presented by the Depositor at the Post Office named thereon, together with the Depositor's book, in which the Postmaster shall enter the amount repaid, and attest the entry with his signature, and the dated stamp of his office. The postmaster shall take a receipt from the Depositor on the warrant for the amount repaid to him, which receipt is not chargeable with stamp duty.

The Postmaster-General will endeavour to prevent fraud, and to identify every Depositor transacting business with the Post Office Savings Bank; but if any person shall fraudulently represent himself to be a Depositor, and by forwarding the proper notice of withdrawal, and by presentation of the Depositor's book, and compliance with the rules of the Department, shall obtain any sum of money belonging to that Depositor, the Postmaster-General will not be responsible for the loss thereof.

Repayments shall be made only to the Depositor in person, or to the bearer of an order under his hand, signed in the presence of either the minister or a churchwarden of the parish in which the Depositor resides, of a justice of the peace, or, in case of sickness, of the medical attendant. If the Depositor be resident abroad, his signature must be verified by some constituted authority of the place in which he resides.

Applications to withdraw money deposited by any friendly, charitable, or provident society, or penny savings bank, must be signed by two of the trustees of any such society, or penny savings bank, or when there is no trustee, then by the treasurer, and the names of the trustee, or treasurer, or other officer of the society authorised to receive the amount to be withdrawn, shall be stated in the notice of withdrawal, and the warrant for payment of the amount shall be made out in the name of such trustee, treasurer, or officer, and the receipt of such person apparently authorised shall be a sufficient discharge for the same.

In case any Depositor shall die leaving any sum of money not exceeding £50, exclusive of interest, deposited in the Post Office Savings Bank, and probate of his will, or letters of administration, be not produced to the Postmaster-General, or if notice in writing of the existence of a will, and intention to prove the same, or to take out letters of administration, be not given to the Postmaster-General, at his principal office within the period of one month from the death of the depositor; or if such notice be given, but such will be not proved, or letters of administration be not taken out, and the probate or letters of administration (as the case may be) produced to the Postmaster-General within the period of two months from the death of the depositor, it shall be lawful for the Postmaster-General, after such period of *one* or *two* months, as the case may be, to pay and divide such funds at his discretion to or amongst the widow, or relatives of the deceased depositor or, any one or more of them; or, if he shall think proper, according to the Statute of Distributions.

In case any Depositor shall die leaving any sum of money in the Post Office Savings Bank which (exclusive of interest) shall exceed the sum of £50, the same shall only be paid to the Executor or Administrator on the production of the Probate of the Will, or Letters of Administration, of the estate or effects of the deceased Depositor to the Postmaster-General.

If any Depositor, being illegitimate, shall die intestate, leaving any person or persons who, but for the illegitimacy of such depositor, and of such person or persons, would be entitled to the money due to such deceased Depositor, it shall be lawful for the Postmaster-General, with the authority, in writing, of the Barrister-at-Law appointed to certify the rules of Savings Banks, to pay the money of such deceased Depositor to any one or more of the persons who, in his opinion, would have been entitled to the same, according to the Statute of Distributions, if the said Depositor and such person or persons, had been legitimate.

In all cases wherein a certificate shall be required of the amount of the Balance standing in the books of the Post Office Savings Bank to the credit of a deceased Depositor for the purpose of obtaining, free of stamp duty, a probate of will or letters of administration, such certificate shall be in the statutory form.

If any Depositor shall become insane, or otherwise incapacitated to act, and the same shall be proved to the satisfaction of the Postmaster-General, and if the Postmaster-General shall be satisfied of the urgency of the case, he may authorise payment from time to time, out of the funds of such Depositor, to any person whom he shall judge proper, and the receipt of such person shall be a good discharge for the same.

If any dispute shall arise between the Postmaster-General and any individual Depositor, or any executor, administrator, next of kin, or creditor, or assignee of a Depositor who may become bankrupt or insolvent, or any person claiming to be such executor, administrator, next of kin, creditor, or assignee, or to be entitled to any money, deposited in the Post Office Savings Bank, then, and in every such case, the matter and dispute shall be referred in writing, to the Barrister-at-Law appointed under the Savings Banks Acts; and whatever award, order, or determination shall be made by the said barrister shall be binding and conclusive on all parties, and shall be final, to all intents and purposes, without any appeal.

The Officers of the Postmaster-General engaged in the receipt or payment of deposits shall not disclose the name of any Depositor, nor the amount deposited or withdrawn by him, except to the Postmaster-General, or to such of his Officers as may be appointed to assist in carrying out the provisions of the Post Office Savings Bank Act.

In the construction of these regulations, unless there is something in the subject or context repugnant thereto, every word importing the singular number only shall mean and include several persons or things, as well as one person or thing, and the converse; and every word importing the masculine gender only shall mean and include a female as well as a male; and the word month shall refer to a calendar and not a lunar month.

That part of the Burgh comprehended within a line commencing at the point where Cartsburn joins the Clyde, thence up the said Burn to the point where it is crossed by Rue-end street; thence along the centre of Rue-end and Cathcart streets to the centre of Cathcart square; thence to the head of William street; thence along the centre of the said street to the Mid quay; thence along the said Mid quay to the Clyde; and thence south-eastward along the margin of the said River to the point first described.—Electors, 175.

THIRD WARD.

That part of the Burgh comprehended within a line commencing at the north-east extremity of the Mid quay, and running along the said quay to the foot of William street; thence along the centre of the said street to the centre of Cathcart square; thence along the said square to Hamilton street; thence along the centre of Hamilton street to Sugarhouse lane; thence down the said lane to the point where Crawford street crosses the West burn; thence down the said burn to where it enters the Clyde; thence along the margin of the said river to the extremity of the Mid quay, being the point first described—Electors, 166.

FOURTH WARD.

This Society has for its object the religious, moral, and intellectual improvement of young men. It is divided into ten separate branches, which meet at the following places every Friday evening, at a quarter to nine o'clock, for religious exercises, viz.:—Branch No. 1, Well-park Free Church Session-house; 2, Free Middle Church do.; 3, Nicholson street U.P. From a line drawn between the Cloch Light and Dunoon Pier to Port-Glasgow, or to any intermediate place, or from any intermediate place, to any other intermediate place, one half-penny per ton.

N.B.—The same chargeable for like distances outwards.

Fractional tonnage to be charged and paid in proportion.

Two-thirds only of the above rates, exigible in respect of vessels towed by steam.

From Greenock, or off Greenock, to Garelochhead, including detention in swinging the vessel, one half-penny per ton; and the same rate in returning; but no Pilot will be obliged to pilot a vessel to the Garelochhead and back for a less sum than fifteen shillings each way.

For every day the Pilot is kept on board after the Compasses are adjusted he shall be entitled to charge five shillings.

For piloting Vessels up or down the Leven, to or from Dumbarton, the Pilots shall not be entitled to charge more than four shillings in addition to the rate for piloting such Vessels on the Clyde; and four shillings for each additional tide he may be detained after the first.

Any Pilot, whether Deep-sea or River, who may be detained at the request of the owner or person in charge of the vessel, after his duties as Pilot have been completed, (shall where not otherwise provided for in these Regulations), in addition to receiving his provisions, be paid by the owner or person in charge of the vessel, Five Shillings per day; and in like proportion for any lesser period he may be detained on board.

N.B.—No differential rates shall in future be recoverable in respect of Foreign Vessels.

SECURITY PRESENTED BY THE SOCIETY.

The only satisfactory evidence that a Life Office affords complete security for the fulfilment of its engagements, is a correct Statement, containing its "Assets," shewing the manner of their investment on the one hand, and its "Liabilities," with the table of Mortality and Rate of Interest by which they have been valued, on the other. * NOTE.—*The entire "Loading" or per centage on future Premiums which is applicable only to future Expenses, Contingencies, and Profits (value £738,155), was, as usual, left untouched. The Public will therefore observe that future Profits have not to any extent been anticipated or encroached upon in declaring past Bonuses, but that the Scottish Widows' Fund possesses every element of security and future profit which a Life Insurance Office entitled to public confidence ought to possess.*

SURRENDER VALUES PAYABLE ON DEMAND.




