**113 Application for Late Hours Catering Licence: BP Express Shopping Ltd

There was submitted a report by the Head of Legal and Administration on an application for a Late Hours Catering Licence by BP Express Shopping Ltd to allow the operation of a takeaway facility at the BP Branchton Convenience Store between the hours of 11 pm and 5 am the following morning on Mondays to Sundays, following submission of a letter of observation by the Chief Constable which indicated that the hours applied for were outwith the Council's policy hours for Late Hours Catering Licences. The Board heard Constable Gailey in support of the Chief Constable's observation and Mr Hunter for the applicant.

Decided: that consideration of the application be continued to the next meeting of the Board to allow Strathclyde Police to provide the applicant with details of all police calls to the premises in the past year.

It was agreed in terms of Section 50(A)(4) of the Local Government (Scotland) Act 1973 as amended that the public and press be excluded from the meeting during consideration of the following item on the grounds that the business involved the likely disclosure of exempt information as defined in Paragraph 6 of Part I of Schedule 7(A) of the Act.
