666 Taxi Fares Review 2008

669 Consultation for Temporary Public Entertainment Licences

There was submitted a report by the Head of Legal and Administration advising the Board of late submission of required certificates in connection with the processing of applications for Temporary Public Entertainment Licences and to request that the Board consider whether it wishes to introduce a strict time limit for the presentation for such certificates.

Decided:

- (1) that all applications for Temporary Public Entertainment Licences shall be subject to a requirement that (a) certificates to the effect that all equipment to be used at the event is in a safe condition and will be installed and maintained in such a condition during the period of the licence and (b) evidence of public liability insurance cover in terms satisfactory to the Council shall be produced no later than five working days prior to the commencement date of the event; and
- (2) that where the certificates are not produced timeously, then the licence application shall be refused either in whole or in relation to the particular equipment for which the certificates have not been produced.

670 Smoking Health & Social Care (Scotland) Act 2005
