69 HMIe Report on Gourock Primary School

There was submitted a report by the Corporate Director Education & Social Care advising the Committee of the results of the HMIe external evaluation of Gourock Primary School. The report advised that the Indicators of Quality had been amended by HMIe and that of the five Indicators, two had been evaluated as "good" and three as "satisfactory".

There was also circulated a strategic action plan which will follow the areas for improvement.

Ms Joan McGill, Head Teacher of Gourock Primary School, was present together with two P7 pupils, Hope Donnachie and Austin Clark, who spoke to the Committee concerning various initiatives in place within the school.

Decided:

- (1) that the Committee endorse the comments made by the HMIe external evaluation of Gourock Primary School and commend the various examples of good practice set out in the report; and
- (2) that a report be submitted to the Committee in one year's time showing the progress made against the strategic action plan.

70 HMIe Follow-through Report on Ardgowan Primary School

There was submitted a report by the Corporate Director Education & Social Care advising the Committee of the results of the HMIe follow-through external evaluation of Ardgowan Primary School which had concluded that there was clear evidence of improvement since the initial September 2006 inspection and that the school was performing well overall. The report further advised that HMIe had indicated that given the continued strong leadership, commitment of staff and support from the education authority, the school was very well placed to continue to improve and that, as a result, they would make no further visits in connection with the September 2006 inspection.

Ms Sheena McFarlane, Head Teacher of Ardgowan Primary School, was present and spoke to this item.

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Decided:

- (1) that the Committee endorse the comments made in the HMIe follow-through report on Ardgowan Primary School; and
- (2) that the Committee's appreciation be conveyed to the Head Teacher, staff and pupils of the school as well as staff within Education Services Headquarters for the work undertaken to achieve the considerable improvements implemented since the initial September 2006 inspection.

71 Revenue Budget 2008/09 - Period 7

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There was submitted a report by the Chief Financial Officer and Corporate Director Education & Social Care on the position of the Revenue Budget 2008/09 as at Period 7 (31 October 2008) which was projected to be on budget.

Decided:

73 Education Service Performance Report - November to December 2008

75 Wider Consultation on Provision from the School Age Language Unit (SALU)

76 The Next Generation of Qualifications in Scotland: Government Consultation

Decided: that approval be given to the response to the Scottish Government consultation as detailed in the appendix to the report.

77 Joint Statement on Community Learning and Development by the Scottish Government and COSLA

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There was submitted a report by the Corporate Director Education & Social Care (1) advising of the Joint Statement on Community Learning and Development (CLD) by the Scottish Government and COSLA, (2) confirming the commitment of Inverclyde Council to the shared vision outlined in the statement and (3) reviewing the progress made by Inverclyde Council and Inverclyde Alliance in addressing the challenges identified in the statement and setting priorities for action.

79 Destinations of Leavers from Scottish Schools 2007-2008

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There was submitted a report by the Corporate Director Education & Social Care on the destinations of leavers from Scottish schools in 2007-2008.

There were circulated to the Committee, Appendix 1 providing comparative information on Inverclyde's performance against all other Scottish local authorities and Appendix 2 showing the destination figures for Inverclyde secondary schools.

Decided:

(1) that the Committee note the highly positive performance of Inverclyde in relation to the destinations of school leavers; and

(2) that all relevant staff within Education Services be commended for the work undertaken to achieve these results.

80 Permission to Seek Tenders for the Provision of School Transport

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There was submitted a report by the Corporate Director Education & Social Care seeking approval to procure transport services with a value of more than £250,000.

Decided: that authority be granted to the Corporate Director Education & Social Care to seek tenders for (1) transport services for pupils with additional support needs and/or medical conditions for school sessions 2009/10, 2010/11 and 2011/12 and (2) transport services for consortium and miscellaneous purposes for school sessions 2009/10, 2010/11 and 2011/12.

81 Moving Forward with a Curriculum for Excellence Strategy 2008/10

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There was submitted a report by the Corporate Director Education & Social Care seeking approval of the Curriculum for Excellence Strategy produced by Education Services for the period 2008/10.

Decided: that approval be given to the content of the Curriculum for Excellence Strategy set out in the appendix and for its publication as detailed in the report.

82 Able Pupils in Inverclyde Schools

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There was submitted a report by the Corporate Director Education & Social Care providing information on the performance of more able pupils in Inverclyde.

Decided: that the Committee note the good progress being made by schools in Inverciyde in relation to more able pupils.

83 Items for Noting

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There was submitted a report by the Corporate Director Education & Social Care providing information for noting on (1) the teaching of history in schools, (2) children educated outwith schools and pupil projections 2008, (3) the outcome of the meeting with Councillor Ahlfeld relative to Gourock Primary School, (4) the outcome of the meeting with the parent chairs of Greenock Academy and Gourock High School, (5) statistics on looked after children 2007/2008 and (6) attendance and absence in Scottish schools 2007/2008.

84 Notice of Motion - Working Group on the Future of Secondary Education Provision in Port Glasgow

"That the Education & Lifelong Learning Committee agrees that the future of secondary education provision in Port Glasgow is of key concern to all elected members of this Council and that efforts to ensure a satisfactory outcome for the people of Port Glasgow should include members of all the parties which make up the Education Committee. Therefore the Committee agrees that the composition of the working group which is looking at the future of secondary education in Port Glasgow should be amended to include one SNP elected member and one Liberal Democrat elected member."

Decided:

- (1) that it be noted that no further meetings of the Working Group will take place pending the report by the Corporate Director Education & Social Care to the Committee on the results of the consultation exercise relative to the future of secondary education provision in Port Glasgow;
- (2) that the Corporate Director Education & Social Care include within his report proposals for the composition of the Working Group including appropriate Elected Member representation; and
- (3) that, in the circumstances, the Notice of Motion be withdrawn.
