1.0 PURPOSE

- 1.1 To advise of the use of the powers delegated to the Chief Executive to confirm the stopping up of footpaths as detailed above in order to allow the necessary stopping up to be carried out.
- 1.2 The reason for requesting the use of emergency powers is that the creation of development platforms and construction of access road and associated works at the said site cannot commence until the Order is confirmed.

2.0 SUMMARY

- 2.1 At the Planning Board on 3 June 2009 the Board granted planning permission for the creation of development platforms and construction of access road and associated works at Kelburn Business Park, Port Glasgow (Para 401(d)).
- 2.2 At the same meeting, the Board granted authority to the Head of Legal & Administration to promote the necessary Stopping Up Order.
- 2.3 The Stopping Up Order is necessary to allow for the creation of development platforms and construction of access road and associated works at Kelburn Business Park, Port Glasgow. The stopping up affects the footpath shown on the attached plan.
- 2.4 The proposed Stopping Up Order was advertised in the "Edinburgh Gazette" and "Greenock Telegraph" and the Notice was served on the appropriate parties and posted at the site.
- 2.5 There are no outstanding objections to the Order as at the date of this report and the statutory period for lodging objections expired on 7 August 2009.

3.0 USE OF EMERGENCY POWERS

- 3.1 The use of the powers delegated to the Chief Executive was authorised by the Chief Executive, Provost McCormick and Councillors Wilson and Brooks.

4.0 RECOMMENDATIONS

- 4.1 That the Council note the use of the powers delegated to the Chief Executive to confirm the Order and to authorise the Head of Legal & Administration to take all the necessary action in connection therewith.
