Subject: Round 2 Applications 2013 - 2014

### 1.0 PURPOSE

1.1 The purpose of this report is to give details of applications received for consideration for funding from the discretionary element of the Grants to Voluntary Organisations Budget in 2013/14; and seek approval for further payments under the 3 year grant scheme.

### 2.0 SUMMARY

- 2.1 The Budget for the Grants to Voluntary Organisations Fund for 2013 2014 is £381,430. Of this, the sum of £120,650 has been committed to organisations in receipt of 3 year funding. Following decisions made at round 1, £125,650 remains to be allocated.
- 2.2 Details of the grant applications received for Round 2 are given in Appendix A. In total, 45 grant applications have been received, with the total sum requested being £206,913. Further information on each application is available on request and will also be available at the Committee meeting.
- 2.3 Inverclyde Voluntary Council of Social Services has received £50,000 through the 3 year grant funding stream. A submission has been made to confirm a further £6,800 to regularise and continue previous payments. At the their last meeting the Grants Committee made a decision to defer payment to Port Glasgow Voluntary Transport for 3 year funding. A summary of these applications is provided at Appendix B.

#### 3.0 RECOMMENDATIONS

- 3.1 It is recommended that the Grants Sub-Committee:
  - a) considers the level of funding to be allocated to the projects in Appendix A; and
  - b) considers the two applications in Appendix B
